

Simple Future Rules

Positives sentences

<u>Who</u>	<u>Form of the verb</u>	<u>Examples</u>
I/He / She / It	Will * verb	He will eat lunch.
You/ we / They		Youwill eat lunch.

Negatives Sentences

	<u>Form of the verb</u>	<u>Examples</u>
I/ You/ We / They	Will not * Verb	You wil lnot help them.
He / She / It		He wil lnot eat lunch.
		He won't eat lunch.

Questions Sentences

<u>Will</u>	<u>who</u>	<u>Form of verb</u>
	I/ He /she / It/	Will he eat lunch?
	You/ We/ They	Will you help them?

Use 'will' when you intend or are willing to do something. In other words, you want to do it, or you have no problem with doing it.

Positive Sentences

<u>Who</u>	<u>Be</u>	<u>Form of Verb</u>	<u>Examples</u>
I	am	going to * verb	I am going to help them
He/She/It	is		He is going to help the
You/ We /It	are		Youare going to help them

Negative Sentences

<u>Who</u>	<u>Be</u>	<u>Form of the verb</u>	<u>Examples</u>
I	am	not going to* verb	I am not going to help them
He/She/It	Is		He is not going to help them
You/ We/ It	are		You are not going to help them

Questions Sentences

<u>Be</u>	<u>who</u>	<u>Form of the Verb</u>	<u>Examples</u>
Am	I	going to * verb	Am I going to help them?
Is	He/she/It		Is He going to help me?
Are	You/We/They		Are you going to help them

Use 'be going to' when something is planned. In other words, It was decided or determined before the time of speaking.
